

1: HO-HO-HOMOPHONES!

TODAY'S CHALLENGE

 UNDERSTAND that some words sound the same even though they have different spelling and meanings

LEARN that these words are called HOMOPHONES

• THINK of words which SOUND THE SAME but are SPELLED DIFFERENTLY

WHAT IS A HOMOPHONE?

 HOMOPHONES are words that sound the same, but have different spelling and meanings

- YOU and EWE
- PALE and PAIL
- BARE and BEAR

 This is great for telling jokes, because you can trick people by swapping homophones to surprise them!

HOW DO JOKES WORK?

- All jokes work in the same way they make you expect one thing, then surprise you with something different
- The bit that makes you expect one thing is the SET-UP
- The bit that surprises you is the PUNCHLINE
- When you work out how the unexpected bit connects with what you did expect, you 'get the joke' and that makes you laugh!
- Jokes are like puzzles for your brain, and the reward you get for solving the puzzle is a good giggle!
- Let's look at a joke now...

DID YOU HEAR ABOUT THE FROG WHOSE CAR BROKE DOWN?

- This is the SET-UP for the joke
- Remember, the set-up's job is to make you EXPECT something
- So what do you expect to hear next?
 - Something about fixing cars?
 - Something about finding a mechanic?
 - Does he call the AA?

Here comes the punchline...



HE GOT TOAD!

- This is the PUNCHLINE and its job is to deliver the UNEXPECTED bit
- The unexpected bit is that TOWED and TOAD are homophones. Your brain recognises this and it tries to find a connection
 - A FROG has a car and it has broken down...
 - Broken-down cars get TOWED to the garage...
 - TOWED sounds like TOAD...
 - A TOAD looks a lot like a FROG
- Your brain has made a connection, and it's really pleased with itself. It releases a chemical into your body and that makes you laugh!
