

What are the different layers called?

Rainforests are characterised by the high rainfall which can be as much as 450 cm annually. Experts estimate that up to 75% of all species of plants and animals are native to rainforests. In fact, they also suggest that many millions of species of plants, insects and animals are still to be discovered in tropical rainforests. Yet, surprisingly, only 6% of the earth's surface is covered in rainforest.
