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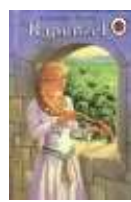
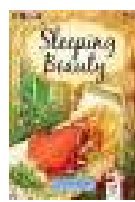
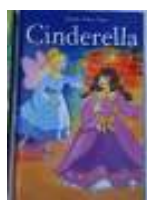
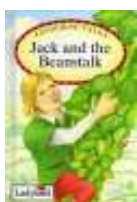


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What's coming up next half term

Bikeability

Bikeability will take place for the children in Woodpeckers, Ospreys and Eagles classes on **Monday 8th, Tuesday 9th and Wednesday 10th May**. This will allow the children to achieve their Level 1 Bikeability Award, a nationally recognised standard for cycling training. Children will be allocated a date nearer the time. Your child will need to be able to cycle on a two wheeled roadworthy bike (working brakes, pumped up tyres etc) and have a bike helmet which conforms with at least standard BSEN1078. If your child wishes to take part in Bikeability and you have not as yet told us (letters did go out in the Autumn Term) please advise the office asap.
