Literacy

In phonics we will continue to recap previous phases and introduce new ones. We encourage the children to apply these in their reading and writing.

We will look at the traditional tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. We will focus on developing writing skills, write labels and instruction sheets. The children will narrate and act their stories out.

Please continue to support your child regularly in practicing their phonemes, keywords and sharing books together.

History

We will be finding out about changes to our homes. We will walk round the village observing different styles of homes, materials used for building and new and old builds.

We will learn the history of why we celebrate Mother's day.

Geography

We will be focussing on the weather. The children will record the weather and be weather presenters.

Maths

We will focus on measurement: length, height, weight and volume.

We will continue to recap on place value to 50 and counting in multiples of 2, 5 and 10s.

Science

We will continue to focus on seasonal changes and the weather associated with this time of year.

The children will be learning about plant structures, new life (frogs) and investigating materials e.g. strength of materials linking to 'The Three Little Pigs'.

We will be thinking about staying healthy. What can we do to help ourselves.

ICT

We will continue to develop our skills of retrieving, creating, manipulating and storing data.
