Well done Ollly!

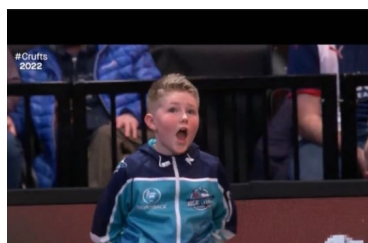
