AND FINALLY, MEET THREE LITTLE PIGS WHO NEED YOUR HELP TO BUILD A STRONG FORTRESS. INSIDE ITS STRONG WALLS, THEY'LL BE SAFE FROM THE BIG, BAD WOLF. NO HUFFING AND PUFFING WILL BLOW YOUR FORTRESS DOWN.

Welcome back after the Easter holidays. We hope you've had a restful and enjoyable break after a busy Spring term! Our topic this half term is Towers, Tunnels and Turrets! As you can see above, we have lots planned, based around castles and other structures.

In **English** we will be exploring non-fiction texts based around the features of castles. We will be learning about reported speech and reading some traditional tales involving bridges, towers and buildings! We will be thinking about writing letters and creating information posters. In **Maths** we will be beginning with fractions and moving onto measurement, including length, height and time. We will also start thinking about position and direction in geometry.

During this topic, we will also cover the following areas:

Science: We will be looking at tunnelling animals and their habitats. We will be creating castle walls and use our knowledge of materials to knock the walls down. We will also investigate bridges and learn about the best shapes and materials to make the strongest bridges. We will end the half term testing biscuit bridges to find the strongest biscuit.

History: We will be finding out about castles from different periods in history and placing them on a time line, as well as exploring their features. We will also be finding out about how tunnels were used in World War 2, using a range of historical sources to research this.

Geography: We will be naming and locating the world's continents and oceans as well as comparing physical and human features in their environment and other places in the world.

RE: We will be asking the question 'Who is an inspiring person?' We will be thinking about stories that inspire Christians, starting with the story of the Prodigal son.

DT: We will be making models of towers, castles and bridges, using a variety of materials, ranging from natural materials found in our environment, to spaghetti and marshmallow bridges!

PSHE: Relationships. See below for the outline.

PE: In PE we will creating our very own Castle dance. We will be looking at using different levels and working in cannon and unison. We must defend our castle from an enemy attack! In our other lesson we will be learning how to improve our accuracy of striking skills. We will work cooperatively in a group or with a partner and understand the safety involved with striking activities. * **Swallows** PE days are Tuesdays and Thursdays and **Larks** are Tuesdays and Fridays

Computing: We will be using Purple Mash to look at the work by William Morris and recreate it by using the patterns template.

Homework: Homework in year 2 consists of reading every day, spellings and Times Tables Rockstars.
